Prep Enrolments 2020

We have 100 places for Prep in 2020. We are taking 2020 Prep enrolment enquiries. To be eligible for Prep, a child must turn five years old by 30 June in 2020. Parents enrolling their child for Prep are required to provide documentary evidence of the date of birth by presenting the child's original Birth Certificate. Both the parent/caregiver and child should attend the interview.

Report Cards

Parents and/or caregivers will receive their student/s reports via email in the week starting 24 June. Reporting is an important part of building our partnerships with parents/caregivers to improve student learning. We want parents/caregivers to understand

- learning expectations for students
- student achievement against achievement standards
- student engagement with the expected learning, and
- how students may be able to improve.

Each semester, we report on student achievement with respect to the aspects of a subjects' achievement standard that students have been taught and assessed on during the reporting period. Reports are reflective of the student's level of achievement at the time of reporting.

Students who receive a WW (Working With) in Prep, Sound in Years 1 and 2, C in Years 3-6 have demonstrated conceptual understanding and skills to meet those aspects of the achievement standard taught and are able to apply them in familiar situations. These academic grades are reflective of students working at the expected level for their age cohort.

Students who attain an AP (Applying) or MC (Making Connections) in Prep, High or Very High in Years 1-2, or A or B in Years 3-6 are demonstrating higher conceptual understanding and skill application from those aspects of the achievement standard taught and are beginning to/able to transfer them to new situations.

From the Deputy Principal Years 3 – 6

Attendance

How many days of school has your child missed so far this year? Research shows that students who have a good attendance record are more likely to achieve high results at school. Regular school attendance will mean that your child has a better chance in life. Your child will achieve better when they go to school all day, every school day. They learn better, they make friends, they are happier and they have a brighter future.

Did you know that:

If a child is absent one day a fortnight, it adds up to 20 days (4 weeks) of missed school in a year. Over 13 years of schooling, that's almost 1.5 years.

If a child is absent one day a week it adds up to 40 days (8 weeks) of missed school in a year. Over 13 years of schooling, that's over 2.5 years.

If a child is absent two days a week, it adds up to 80 days (16 weeks) of missed school in a year. Over 13 years of schooling, that's over 5 years!

Attendance counts, all day, every day.

Student Safety

A safe and supportive environment for our students is a priority at Petrie. Part of this is ensuring that everyone understands and follows emergency procedures for evacuations and lock-downs. Each term as a whole school we practise our evacuation and lock-

down procedures so that everybody automatically knows what to do in an emergency.

When we hold these drills, and in a real emergency, we are required to account for everybody who is on the school grounds. This is one reason we ask parents to sign in and out when they come to help in classrooms, or to pick up or drop off their child during school hours. If you are coming to the school during school hours, please ensure you call in at the office to sign in and collect your sticker to wear.

Staff Carpark

There has been an increasing number of cars entering the school yard before and after school. We ask that you support us in keeping our students safe. **Access is not permitted to anyone but staff.**

Road Safety

Children and young people are at significant risk on our roads. Road trauma is the leading cause of death and the second most frequent cause of hospitalisation among children in Australia (World Health Organisation, 2008).


We all need to learn to use the road responsibly. There is evidence that children start learning about the road system from a very early age and that this can lead to safer behaviours in later life.

Road safety education plays an important role in shaping the attitudes and behaviours of children and young people – ensuring they become responsible drivers, passengers, pedestrians and cyclists

It is essential that children learn and implement the correct crossing procedure of **Stop, Look, Listen, and Think.**

Working Bee News

Thank you SO much to the 100 parents, students and staff who attended our working bee on Saturday afternoon. What we achieved in just two hours is proof that many hands make light work. The work completed:

1. Base/primer coat to the playground near the tennis courts. This will allow our grounds staff to complete the coloured top coat within the next few weeks.
2. Tennis court cleaning. Special thanks to Bryan Sweeney and Julian Richards for coming in early Saturday morning with the big industrial gurney to commence the scrubbing of the tennis courts. This was a massive undertaking as it has been some time this this area was done. The results speak for themselves.
3. Mulching the embankment behind the tennis courts/hall. Due to the overwhelming success of the mulch program on the far embankment we have decided to mirror this on the embankment behind the tennis courts/hall. We were very lucky to have some mulch donated and our working bee team did a phenomenal job in moving the lot. We will continue to seek donations to complete this area.
4. Cleaning out the Titan shed. As part of our classroom furniture audit we needed to do a massive cull of the old furniture in the shed. Thanks to the working bee team we disposed of a large number of old, damaged and unsuitable furniture, delivered some suitable furniture and we are now able to commence purchasing new classroom furniture.
5. Admin Building paint touch ups. Working towards finalising our admin refurb we needed to do some touch up work to the old doors and door frames in the building – this was another job completed by the working bee team.

Student Accounts

Statements have gone home again this week as a courtesy reminder of monies owing. We thank those families whose accounts have been paid, those in credit and those with Centrepay arrangements. Parents/Carers are reminded that Student Resource Scheme Term 1 payments are now well overdue, Term 2 payments are due now and that all accounts should be finalised by the end of Term 3. Accounts must be finalised for Year 5 and 6 students to attend camp.

If you are experiencing financial hardship we encourage you to contact us so that we can assist with a payment plan or student welfare funding.

Excursions & Camps

The Year 5 and Year 6 camp bookings have now been finalised. Parents are reminded that all accounts (including SRS) must be paid in full for your student to be eligible to attend camp.

Copies of permission notes are available on the school website or additional copies can be obtained from the payment window between 8.15am - 9.00am each morning. We ask parents to pay particular attention to excursion and deposit cut off dates as we are required to make firm bookings for attendance and buses in advance. Students cannot attend events without written permission, irrespective of payment status, due to insurance and safety reasons.
