Under this agreement for 2022
Petrie State School will receive

\$227,170*

This funding will be used to

- Increase percentages of student achieving A - C in English from 82% to 87%.
- Increase percentages of students achieving A – B in English from 44% to 50%.
- Increase percentages of students reaching benchmark reading levels across the school from 54% to 60%.
- Increase percentages of students recorded with a disability under NCCD (Nationally Consistent Collection of Data) achieving A – C in English from 65% to 75%.

Our initiatives include

- Regular targeted classroom walkthroughs and feedback using Sharrat's five questions for learning.
- Embedding a whole school approach to pedagogy utilising learning walls, feedback and goal setting (Hattie, Sharrat et. al).
- Collaboratively developing and communicating the school's vision of inclusive practices to drive teacher pedagogy.
- Embedding the school's reading program to lift student reading and English achievement.
- Increase teacher clarity through dedicated whole planning days for classroom and support teachers each term to take part in the regional approach to pre moderation and collaborative assessment of student work.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

Using I4S funding to increase second Deputy Principal position from 0.5 to 10 FTE with a focus on monitoring and improving pedagogy through walkthroughs, coaching, and feedback to teachers	\$80,000
Using I4S funding to provide TRS for full day planning each term to all teaching staff to allow for planning for differentiation and individual goal setting processes	\$70,000
Using I4S funding to purchase additional teacher aide support to assist in the delivery of the whole school reading program and to support differentiation in classrooms	\$65,000
Using I4S funding to enact an observation and feedback schedule targeted at reading agenda, ensuring quality pedagogy and consistency across the entire school	\$12,170
